Hiro-o is a pocket of tranquility where one can witness scenes of daily life. At times, you might chance upon foreign looking architecture and many embassies, as well as quiet residential buildings and temples. This area also has small local art spots like galleries, bookstores and cafes.

The vibrant Ebisu area is loved for its Yebisu beer history. The old brewery has been transformed into a museum, and there's no shortage here of spacious beer gardens and restaurants, especially around Yebisu Garden Place. This area also has many shops, galleries, and a cinema, in addition to being the home of Tokyo Photographic Art Museum.


